

Medicare GLP-1 Bridge: How to Talk to Your Pharmacist

The Bridge program starts July 1, 2026. A little preparation can help you get your prescription routed the right way.



Start the Conversation

Try saying:

"My doctor said this prescription should go through the Medicare GLP-1 Bridge program. Can you check that for me?"

"I was told I'm eligible for the Medicare GLP-1 Bridge program. Can you help me get the prescription through Bridge?"



What to Check

Your pharmacist can help check whether the prescription includes:

- An obesity diagnosis code
- The information needed to route the claim correctly

The prescription should include:

SEND TO BRIDGE FOR WEIGHT MANAGEMENT



Questions to Ask

- Does this prescription and prior authorization have everything you need to send it to Bridge?
- Do you need to contact my doctor for more information?
- If approved, will my copay be \$50?



Routing Reminder

Bridge uses a separate claims process. These numbers may help the pharmacy route the claim correctly.

What Happens Next

- 1 Your pharmacy sends the claim to Bridge.
- 2 If prior authorization is needed, the pharmacy sends the request to your doctor.
- 3 If approved, the pharmacy processes the prescription through Bridge.



Cost Reminder

If approved, your copay through Bridge is expected to be \$50 per month.



Injection supplies needed for certain medications are not included and must be purchased separately, so plan for this additional expense.



At the Pharmacy

Talk to your pharmacist. Confirm the claim is being sent to Bridge. Bring your Part D or Medicare Advantage plan card.
